Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objectives and Strategies

The Compass Conservative Portfolio ("Portfolio") aims to preserve principal, reduce volatility, and provide investors with income and the potential for capital appreciation by investing primarily in fixed income securities.

Under normal conditions, the Portfolio holds an asset-mix consisting of 0-24% cash, 60-86% fixed income and 10-24% equities and alternative investments. The investments held in the Portfolio are diversified by asset class and investment style to minimize volatility and maximize risk-adjusted long-term returns.

Risk

There were no significant changes to the investment objective and strategies that affected the Fund's overall level of risk during the reporting period. The risks of investing in the fund and the suitability of the fund for investors remain as outlined in the Simplified Prospectus.

Results from Operations

The Portfolio's net asset value decreased to \$1.86 billion as at December 31, 2023, from \$1.96 billion at the end of 2022. The change in asset value was due to a combination of net outflows and positive investment returns.

For the year, the Portfolio's Series A units returned 8.86%, outperforming both the broad-based index and the blended benchmark which returned 6.69% and 8.61% respectively. The Portfolio's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, while broad-based index and blended benchmark returns do not include any costs of investing. The first half of 2023 saw headline inflation globally begin to moderate. Higher interest rates put stress on bank balance sheets causing some regional bank failures in the US and abroad in the first quarter. Central banks provided necessary backstops, and continued their hawkish rhetoric reinforcing their commitment to reducing inflation back to target levels. Through the back-half of the year, commodity prices remained low despite the emergence of a new geopolitical conflict between Israel and Hamas. The last two months in particular saw market sentiment shift towards the expectation of rate cuts in 2024 rallying both stock and bond markets. A potential soft-landing for global developed markets is possible, but the central banks remain vigilant emphasizing that further rate hikes could still be possible should inflation flare up again.

About 5% of the portfolio is invested in short-term floating rate notes. Interest rates for short-term debt obligations moved slightly higher during the period as the Bank of Canada raised the overnight lending rate 0.75% during the period. This part of the portfolio generated a gross return of about 6.3% for the period.

The Bank of Canada raised its short-term target rate through 2023 from 4.25% to 5% as central banks globally continued their efforts to temper rising inflation. Bond yields rose for the first three quarters of the year, as central banks remained resolute in taming inflation. The last quarter of the year saw inflation continuing to decline, leading to soft tones out of central banks, resulting in yields falling and corporate bond spreads narrowing. Narrowing spreads benefitted the portfolio holdings as it is invested in a higher weighting of corporate bonds compared to the broad Canadian investment grade universe. The portfolio's allocation to high yield bonds also saw price increases on average as high yield spreads came down through the year. The

commercial mortgage component continues to have an attractive ongoing yield with performance that is less influenced by the volatility in bond and equity markets.

A focus over the past couple years has been increasing the average credit quality of the portfolio, and that continued through 2023. The Portfolio overall is positioned defensively for both the possibility of further volatility in interest rates, but also for the potential for deteriorating credit markets on pressures from far higher rates compared to the last decade.

The portfolio had a 19% weight in equities at year end. The US equity market—propelled by its large tech sector—advanced the most out of major developed markets. Market returns were especially concentrated within the “magnificent seven” stocks (Apple, Microsoft, Nvidia, Alphabet, Tesla, Meta, and Amazon), accounting for over 60% the S&P 500’s return. Earnings, while expected to grow at a faster pace from AI efficiencies in the future, have yet to materialize. For the US market in particular, the rise in equity prices without the earnings growth has pushed up equity valuations compared to other global markets. The US equities within the Portfolio saw overall positive returns during the period. Defensive selections within information technology stocks did well in absolute terms but less overall weight invested in the “magnificent seven” detracted from relative performance.

Canadian equities benefited seeing strong returns overall despite having a large materials and energy sector that faced headwinds due to declining commodity prices. While prices advanced, earnings for 2023 did not. This indicates some degree of economic slowdown even as labor markets remain strong and top line sales continue to grow. The Canadian equity portion of the portfolio saw positive returns through the period. Sub-advised assets through Cidel performed relatively better, offsetting some underperformance from Mawer’s Canadian large-cap mandate.

International equity markets benefited from this advancement globally seeing strong returns through the year in both European, and Asian markets. Much like North American markets, inflation is moderating and labor markets remain strong. Calls for a recession coming out of 2022 went unanswered and companies overall managed to increase earnings for the year. Valuations continue to be attractive for international stocks on both a relative basis compared to US stocks, and absolute versus historical norms. The international equities within the Portfolio saw overall positive returns for the period. Within the largecap active holdings, an underweight in European banks led to relative underperformance in the financial sector as the biggest detractor.

In summary, 2023 allowed investors to sigh with relief and pare losses, with both equity and bond markets posting strong returns. Overall, inflation seems to be declining, and markets expect a slowdown for next year, leading to central bank rate cuts sooner rather than later. Whether we see an eventual recession or a soft landing remains to be seen, but we remain cautiously optimistic. The fund is well positioned to help mitigate the short-term impact of volatility and achieve our portfolio investment objectives over the long run.

Recent Developments

Throughout the year ATB Investment Management Inc. made adjustments to the Portfolio's target asset allocation. The overall equity weight was trimmed by about 4% with the proceeds being added to fixed income as bond yields have increased.

There are no other developments or changes to report at this time related to the investment objectives, investment strategies or management of any of the ATB Funds, or to the policies of the Independent Review Committee (IRC). In June, 2023, a new member joined the ATB Fund’s IRC.

Related Party Transactions

The Portfolio is managed by ATB Investment Management Inc. (“ATBIM” or the “Manager”), a wholly owned subsidiary of ATB Financial.

The Manager provides the Portfolio with administrative services, including providing key management personnel to the Portfolio. In return the Manager receives an administrative fee which is allocated among the Series based on the average net asset value of each Series. Administrative expenses (excluding GST) paid by the Portfolio to the Manager for services provided by ATB Financial and its subsidiaries were \$72,388 for the period ended December 31, 2023 (\$78,490 - December 31, 2022).

ATBIM has established an IRC which acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if applicable, approvals with respect to any conflict of interest matters. IRC oversight ensures that there are no conflicts of interest that would be harmful to unitholders.

Management Fees

ATBIM receives management fees of 1.20% per annum for Series A, 0.45% per annum for Series F1 and 0.35% per annum for Series P. The management fees for Series A, Series F1 and Series P are calculated as a percentage of their net asset value as of the close of business on each business day. Series O unit investors are charged a negotiated management fee, which is paid directly to the manager by the Series O unit investor. The amount of the management fee will depend on the size of the holdings of the Series O unit investor and/or whether the investor is an employee of the Manager or an affiliate. The maximum annual management fee payable for Series O units of each Pool will not exceed the management fee charged with respect to Series A units of the same Portfolio.

For the period ended December 31, 2023, the Portfolio paid ATBIM management fees of \$13,583,235. The Portfolio's management fees were used by ATBIM to: pay costs for managing the investment portfolios; provide investment analysis and recommendations; make investment decisions; purchase and sell investments; and provide other services. Approximately 48% of total management fees were used to pay for sales and trailing commissions. The remaining 52% of management fees were used to pay for investment management.

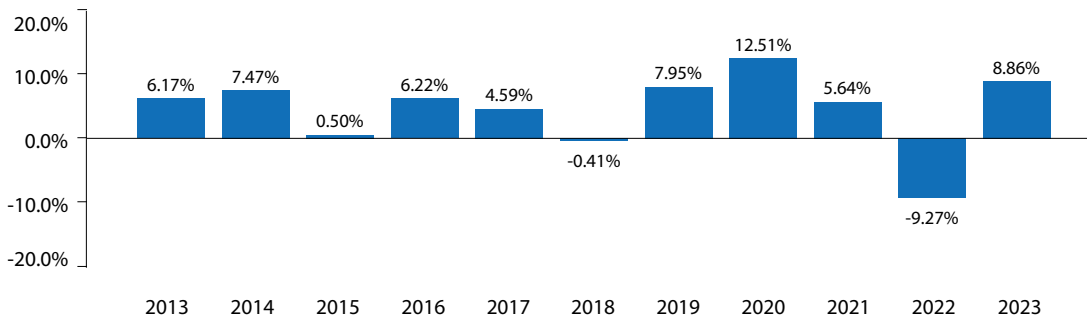
Past Performance

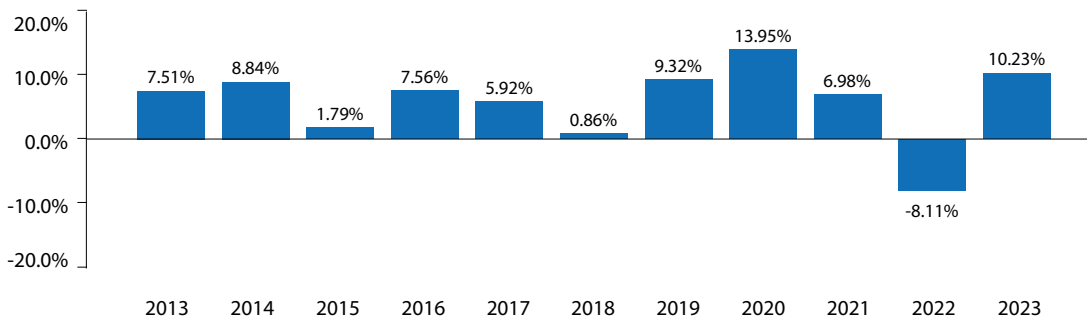
Year by Year Returns

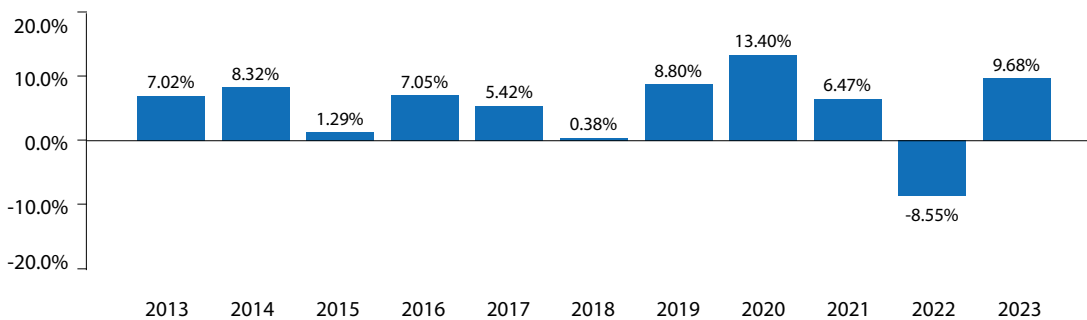

Index Descriptions

FTSE TMX 91-Day T-Bill Index

S&P/TSX Composite Total Return Index

This index is a capitalization weighted index measuring the performance of the largest companies on the Toronto Stock Exchange as measured by market capitalization. This index gives investors a broad measure of the overall performance of the Canadian stock market.

S&P 500 Total Return Index (CDN\$)

This index is a capitalization weighted index measuring the Canadian dollar performance of 500 widely held common stocks representing all major industries in the United States. This index gives investors a broad measure of the overall performance of the U.S. stock market.

MSCI EAFE Total Return Index (CDN\$)

This index is a broad measure of the Canadian dollar performance of stocks from developed equity markets covering countries in Europe, Australasia and the Far East. This index gives investors a broad measure of the overall performance of international stock markets.
